Dear Ms Janmohamed, I am pleased that Mrs Alger took the trouble to read my column and respond to it. I appreciate her valuable feedback. My response to the issues she raises is as follows.	
Do you think Tony Allwright is inciting racial violence when he describes animal rights campaigners "craven" for not confronting Muslims and Jews regarding their halal method of killing? Nevertheless, maybe bodies such as the ARC (Animal Rights Coalition) and ALF (Animal Liberation Front) do indeed try actively to obstruct and shut down the work of Islamic slaughterhouses, targeting anyone who co-operates with them, but if so they seem to get very little publicity nor indeed suffer any backlash. Strange, no? On the other hand, seeing the global mayhem and murder a few childish cartoons or a carelessly named teddy bear can provoke, one can understand why the ARC/ALF might prefer to direct their robust confrontations towards placid Westerners rather than anything Islamic.
